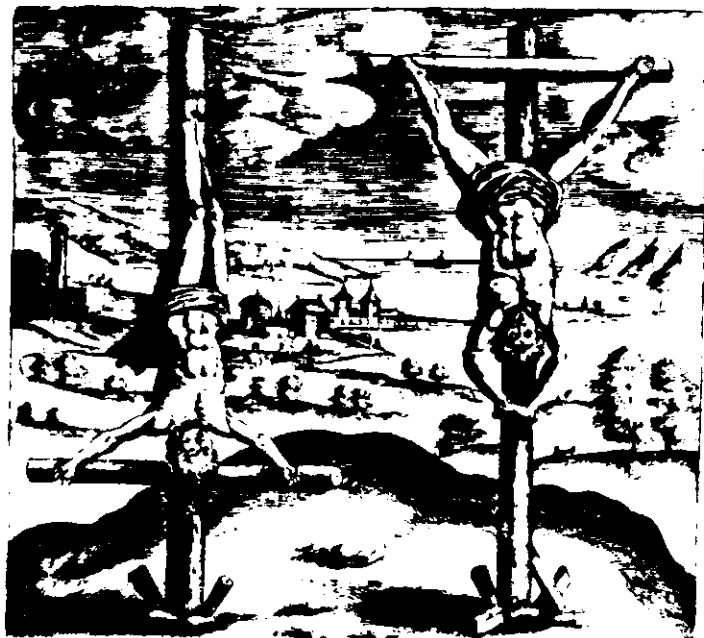
The illustrations on this page are also from Justus Lipsius' book.

In his book Justus Lipsius believed Christ to have died on a cross with a crossbeam.

However, the Watchtower Society ignores his comments, and these other many illustrations, and gives only that of the *Crux simplex*, making the dogmatic and unfounded statement that:

"This is the manner in which Jesus was impaled."

Note: The method of crucifying a person upside down, as it is depicted on the far lower left is the method the apostle Peter is said to have chosen.
